

## **HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY**

This document outlines our policy for Health and Safety, including additional scope that the policy applies to, where appropriate.

## **OUR PURPOSE**

At BUMA Australia, we believe that our safety and health objectives are achieved through effective leadership, resources, systems, safe work environment and our care for each other.

## **OUR OBJECTIVES**

To achieve our purpose, we:

- believe that our leadership <u>at all levels</u> demonstrate a visible commitment to safety and are accountable for ensuring safe work environments for all of our people (Leadership)
- care for the safety of self and others
- \* take pride in our work environment and equipment standards. (Work environment and Equipment)
- maintain and review our systems, so they support safe and compliant outcomes (Systems)
- set safety objectives and measure and report on our performance
- adopt a risk-based approach to safety, ensuring that critical controls are identified, implemented, verified, and maintained to prevent serious incidents and fatalities.
- empower our people to stop work if it is unsafe or Critical Controls are not in place or effective, and we fix it.
- work cooperatively and constructively with our suppliers, contractors and clients
- work by our Cardinal Rules and Environmental Principles
- develop and train our people to be competent, capable, safe and productive (Training)
- think before we act using our risk assessments (Risk Assessment)
- embrace near misses as an opportunity to prevent incidents
- prioritise and practise our physical and psychological wellbeing
- proactively identify, assess, and manage psychosocial hazards such as bullying, harassment, and role conflict.
- require and support our people to be fit for work, report incidents, hazards, unsafe practices and follow procedures
- display this policy in our workplace and integrate its objectives in the way we do work.

## **OUR EXPECTATIONS**

- All employees and contractors must actively participate in hazard identification, risk assessments, and the verification of critical controls.
- Everyone is responsible for looking out for their own safety and the safety of others.
- Leaders must proactively identify and manage psychosocial risks alongside physical hazards.
- All personnel must comply with safety policies, procedures, and critical controls to ensure a safe working environment.
- Employees are empowered to stop work if it is unsafe or if critical controls are not in place or effective, and we will fix it.
